BEAVER & LAKE SPECIAL REPORT

Here are some pictures of the nuisance trapping that I have completed for CCGF.

As many of you know I have been quite busy with removing the beavers from the Clubs main lake as well as muskrats from all the 3 lakes.

It started to get crazy with beavers in Mid November of 2015 as we had a sudden movement of beaver taking up residence on the property. I did not complete the removal of all beavers until June of 2016 as we had 2 more move in making the total within that time period 6 beavers. I have to tell you that working around a beaver lodge in June with the temperatures up near 80, between the blue mud and snakes and mosquitos, I had to be very careful. I absolutely hate snakes and I saw several and almost stepped on one, nuff of snakes gives me the shivers even telling you about them. I enjoyed every second of it.



on top of this lodge. I am quite sure this was there main food lodge as there was a lot of Green fresh cut wood stashed in front of this lodge and wedged together deep in the water for winter use. What some may not realize as they still make there den back in the bank for protection. The second Lodge which was an old downed tree, with a huge pile of sticks on top. That was a beauti-



ful sight back in the cove to the right of the camping area. What's interesting and as time went along I found the main entrance to this lodge which went back under the lodge into the bank. I also found a Bank Den not 10Ft from this lodge to the left that I took a 52lb beaver from. In all as



you know I removed 6 beavers from the lake. Two of the beaver, one being 52lbs and the other at 50lbs were huge. The other beavers ranged from 30lbs down to the 20lb range. In all I had most of my big traps in use to cover all the bank dens on the big lake. If one of those beavers decided to make a bank den in the Dam,



efforts to watch the Dam of the big lake. When I take the muskrats out of the big lake they come off the dam from bank dens mostly and a couple other hot spots. I can say from the constant pressure we place on the muskrat population on club grounds the numbers from several years ago

to now has drastically dropped.

The members only lake only produced 1 muskrat this year. The dozer work that was done I feel ,helped crush the bank runs a long the Gun Range side for now. Otters? I have not had sign of otters in a couple of years on club grounds. That doesn't mean they haven't been there, they just didn't stay long enough for me to meet up with them. I have removed otters from neighboring streams so perhaps that has helped that they not reach club grounds.

I have tried to give you the best information I can to keep you updated on the Nuisance trapping on the Club Grounds. As always I am always glad when you call me regarding nuisance animals you might encounter or a club member reports. The report I was given back in June were of tremendous help, to get those beaver out of there as quick as possible

If you have any questions or concerns please do not hesitate to call me. I will check the lakes periodically and keep you posted. Respectfully Bob Woeste


The first picture is a pine tree that they had cut off and as you can see they were eating the bark off and by the time I got there to trap most of it was gone. I did remove one beaver from this location.
