# \*Upcoming\*

Members will soon vote on proposed changes to Articles 6 and 7. Please read these proposals.

### Current Article 6 Section 3

The Treasurer shall have custody of all funds of the Association, except the clubhouse fund, and disburse them on the authority of the Board of Trustees. The exception being that he is authorized to expend an amount not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for any one bill to settle just bills and charges due and payable by the Association and those bills for the standard operating expenses, without the authority of the Board of Trustees. The Treasurer shall be bonded. The Bond shall be fixed annually at the December meeting, before the election of officers or trustees.

### Proposed Article 6 Section 3

The Treasurer shall have custody of all funds of the Association, except the clubhouse fund, and disburse them on the authority of the Board of Trustees. The exception being that he is authorized to expend an amount not to exceed seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00) for any one bill to settle just bills and charges due and payable by the Association and those bills for the standard operating expenses, without the authority of the Board of Trustees. The Treasurer shall be bonded. The Bond shall be fixed annually at the December meeting, before the election of officers or trustees.

### Current Article 6 Section 7a

On any motion on the floor, other than an emergency, wherein an expenditure of over three hundred (\$300.00) dollars is involved, said motion will be tabled and processed by the Board of Trustees at their regular monthly meeting, and their recommendation presented to the membership at the next monthly meeting. In the event a motion is presented of an emergency nature, involving the expenditure of over three hundred dollars (\$300.00) the Board of Trustees present at a regular meeting may caucus and return to the meeting with their immediate recommendation.

### Proposed Article 6 Section 7a

On any motion on the floor, other than an emergency, wherein an expenditure of over seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00) is involved, said motion will be tabled and processed by the Board of Trustees at their regular monthly meeting, and their recommendation presented to the membership at the next monthly meeting. In the event a motion is presented of an emergency nature, involving the expenditure of over seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00) the Board of Trustees present at a regular meeting may caucus and return to the meeting with their immediate recommendation.


